Uniform and toys from home

Finally the sunshine has appeared and the children are able to wear their summer uniform. Please ensure that hair is tied back and shoes/sandals are compliant with the school policy (extract below).

Summer uniform may be worn from Easter until the end of Term 1 in the autumn, although children are permitted to wear their winter uniform all year round. The summer uniform consists of:

- Grey shorts or a green and white striped or green and white checked dress
- Dark or white sandals (socks or tights must be worn) as an alternative to black shoes.
- Black, dark green or grey tights or black, dark green, grey or white socks
- Children should also have a suitable hat to protect their faces and necks in warm weather
- Make-up, nail varnish and dyed hair is not allowed. Fashion or extreme hairstyles are not permitted. Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back. Hair accessories should be discreet and dark in colour, e.g. black, brown or dark green. Oversized hair accessories are not allowed.

We would recommend that your child also brings in labelled sun cream that they can apply themselves.


Y6 SATs

Raising a child with additional needs can be challenging in many ways and expert help and support can make a real difference to day to day life. If you are a parent/carer/grandparent/foster parent to a child or young person with SEN you may wish to register with Wiltshire Parent Carer Council (WPCC). They are an excellent organisation that offer a wide range of support and advice:

'Registering with the WPCC is free and brings many benefits. By registering with the WPCC, you will receive our free weekly newsletter which is full of information to help and support parent carers of children and young people with SEND in Wiltshire, and often professionals as well. Through our newsletter, you will find out about events, workshops and courses, training opportunities, activities for children and young people, opportunities to have a say and help shape some of the services you use, and so much more.'

On-street parking at drop-off and pick-up

As a school we have no jurisdiction with respect to enforcing parking regulations and recognise that where parents choose to park is their own choice and responsibility. We have, however, had several complaints from other road users and those in the locality about unsafe and inconvenient parking. This is particularly on double yellow lines on and around the bend at the top of The Holloway.

We are therefore requesting that, unless there is a very specific reason that would be supported by the Highway Code, parents always use the Cross Hayes carpark or park a distance from the school and "Park and Stride" to drop-off and pick-up.

We work hard to keep positive relationship with all our neighbours, who naturally blame us for parking that is inconsiderate or dangerous. We thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation.
