# **Exciting Athelstan 1100 History Focus**

As you may be aware, the town of Malmesbury will be celebrating the importance of King Athelstan in British history as well as our own town's history.

So that the children in St Joseph's are part of this and also understand the importance of King Athelstan, we will have a special history curriculum focus of King Athelstan and his place in the Saxon and Viking period of British history. The work we will be doing will also run parallel with the town's Big Dig activities.

So that you understand what to expect, the following is a summary of the activity areas we are planning.

<u>Week 1 (beginning 24<sup>th</sup> June)</u>: Who were the Saxons (and Vikings – Y6) and why was Malmesbury important to them? Our focus work will start with an assembly with visitors from Historic England who will give each child a historical question to answer. In answering this question the children will be exploring maps and photographs, placing events from this period on a time line and thinking about what life might have been like for Saxon / Viking people. Understanding Saxon / Viking life will be part of an immersion morning where children may be invited by their class teacher to dress as Saxons / Vikings. During their class's immersion morning children will learn about Saxon / Viking crafts, how they built homes and what foods they may have eaten. All these activities will be hands on historical enquiry.

<u>Week 2 (beginning 1<sup>st</sup> July)</u>: What do archaeologists do? Our focus will now change slightly and the children will learn about what archaeologist do. The week's activity will enable all children to take part in our version of the town's Big Dig. Over the week, the children will find out how archaeologists undertake an excavation, how they record their findings and how this helps them find out about the past. Within this week the children will also undertake a dig on our land and will search for evidence of everyday life in the Saxon / Viking period.

Parents are reminded that that our school is probably one of the only schools in Britain that is built on a registered and protected historical monument.

By doing these activities in school we hope to ensure that all children will have the opportunity to feel part of the town's Big Dig which is planned to happen on the weekend of the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> of July.



<u>Week 3 (beginning 8<sup>th</sup> July)</u>: Can we answer our question? This is the week where the children will try to draw all their knowledge from the past two weeks together and see if they can answer Historic England's enquiry question from Week 1. Each class will share their answers with Historic England and the other children in the school.

Any particularly practical activities requiring your child to wear or bring something into school will be communicated by your child's class teacher in advance of the event.

#### This week's Wednesday Word is CALM.
