

### Headteachers' message



Dear parents, carers, children and families,

We have had a very successful week with two Harvest celebrations, victory at the Year 3/4 Rugby Festival, Stone Age history immersions in year 3 and 4 as part of this term's theme and very active play and lunch times.

Thank you to everyone who has made donations for our Harvest celebration and in support of Malmesbury's District Foodbank and Doorway charity in Chippenham. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.

#### Worship:

This week's worship focused on the importance of Harvest time and the gratitude we should all have for the food that is available to us. As part of Monday's worship I asked the children to reflect on all the other things they could be grateful for and how the lives of children in other parts of the world can be very different from their own.

Our scripture reading came from Genesis and recognises our responsibility for being thankful for all that God has given us. Our prayer was a conversation with God to acknowledge this.

At harvest time, we are thinking about God's gifts to us. In particular we are thinking about the food we have and thanking God for this gift.

As detailed when I first informed you of Mrs Bradley's absence, the current arrangements were only a short term solution to ensure stability for the class. Going forward this has remained our priority and I am pleased to inform you that we have been able to secure a teacher called Ms Weatherall until the end of the year. Ms Weatherall worked with the class this week - she is an experienced KS2 teacher, and is also particularly skilled in supporting children with special educational needs.

#### Home learning:

Thank you to parents and carers who completed our home learning questionnaire. We recognise that for some families this may be a contentious subject however we hope the following will allow you to have consistent guidance on our expectations and goals with respect to children's learning at home. The following is our policy with respect to home learning and personal study:

#### Home Learning and Personal Study

We believe there is a place for home learning but also see the value in children having space and freedom to pursue interests and activities beyond school. To this end we believe that there is a fine balance between home and school commitments and have tried to balance what we think will support learning whilst at the same time allowing children to pursue out of school interests.

Why we believe home learning and personal study is important:

We know that children who read and are read to regularly at home develop a wider vocabulary, have ideas to tap into and see reading as something that can open doors. We also know that children who practice spellings and basic number operations (multiplication and number bonds) develop quick recall and this enables them to progress faster in writing and mathematics computation. In addition to the above we also recognise that home learning also encourages independence and self-discipline, particularly as children get older. What we are asking parents to support their child to achieve:

- Reading: (3- 4 x / week) This can be a school or any appropriate book from home. All we ask is that when children read to you or themselves you record or witness this in their reading record.
- Spelling: (5 days, 5 10 minutes). We will provide 5 separate sheets to complete this on. Children's spelling practice also supports their development of a neat and efficient handwriting style
  - Maths Fluency Activities: This might be TT RockStars or any other appropriate activity t strengthen number skills (3 4 x / week) 5 10 minutes

So that the organisation of home learning is consistent, all classes will collect and give out Home Learning on a Friday. Spelling tests will happen as part of Friday's routine.

Other occasional home learning tasks may also be included for some classes, age groups or children at specific times. These may help children get more from their school learning or to help address a specific area of need.

We enjoyed a fantastic afternoon of Harvest Praise and celebration on Tuesday. It was lovely to see so many parents and carers in school and this helped make it a special and memorable event. Well done to all our classes for coming together to celebrate the season and enjoy each other's performances.
