Headteachers' message

Dear parents, carers, children and families,

It was good to have St Scholastica back in school this week. We have had a slightly more routine week with the exception of Day 2 filming for our promotional video and a visit from the Big Bad Wolf in St Lawrence and St Francis. This week's "Wow" moments will give you more detail.

Thank you to all parents who completed our Home Learning Questionnaire. I am in the process of collating these responses and drafting and updating our Home Learning Policy. This will be fed back shortly.

Lastly, please check our diary of upcoming events and in particular our Harvest celebrations next week. As detailed in last week's newsletter, we will be holding two celebrations. The first is on Monday 7th October – this will be a special harvest service led by members of our Chaplaincy Team, Mrs Cambray Smith and me. Austin - "I enjoyed creating sand art whilst on our beach exploration day."




St Lawrence - Mrs Cambray-Smith:
