Dear Parents and Carers,

What a change in the seasons we have had this week. There was real excitement across the school earlier on in the week with the first flakes of snow for the season. We were really pleased to welcome Miss Thomson back to school this week. Her class seem very settled and she has been able to catch up with all her parent / teacher appointments. ### Worship:

We continued our focus on kindness and how, if this is our mind-set, there will be no bullying in the school.
