## Remembrance Mass on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November at 10:00:

We will be holding our first mass of the year on Monday November 11<sup>th</sup> November. This will be in St Aldhelm's Church and will be the first mass supported by the school's new chaplains. The theme for the mass is "remembrance" and as well as thinking about those that have lost their lives in conflict there will also be a moment in the mass where we remember anyone who has sadly died and is important to those within our school community. We will then add them to our book of remembrance and read their names out in our bidding prayers. This is a community mass and all parents are invited to join us.
