

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Aldhelm's,

We hope you are ok wherever you are. We are delighted to be in touch with you through this newsletter.

We extend a warm welcome to all visitors and thank you for joining us in celebrating the Lord's love for us in the Holy Eucharist. There are no strangers here, just new friends you have not yet met!

Scripture summarised

The first reading describes God's compassion and forgiveness, as He heals the spiritual blindness of His Chosen People through their captivity in Babylon and promises their liberation. This connects with the Gospel, where Jesus, on His journey to Jerusalem, heals blind Bartimaeus, fulfilling Jeremiah's prophecy of Israel's joyful return from exile. The Responsor al Psalm (Ps 126) echoes this hope: "Those that sow in tears shall reap rejoicing!" The second reading from Hebrews 5 highlights Jesus as the perfect sacrifice and compassionate High Priest, sharing in our human nature. The Gospel demonstrates Jesus's mercy as He heals Bartimaeus, who, through faith, gains both physical and spiritual sight.
