## Headteachers' message

## Dear Parents and Carers,

What an eventful start to the week we had. Thank you for your support and understanding around our late opening. As it was, things in Malmesbury all turned our OK for the school on Monday morning. However, this was not the case for several staff who, as a result of the flooding, had very challenging journeys to school. The remainder of the week has been relatively calm as we prepare ourselves for the start of advent. ## Worship this week:

Our focus for Monday's values worship was inspired by the Rainbow at the end of the Noah's Ark account in the Bible. I talked to the children about how this was God's sign to humanity that he would not do this again. We discussed what was meant by this promise and linked this to Jesus being the light of the world who had challenged us to keep his light alive through the kind acts we did to each other. Linking this to the rainbow, I used the different colours of the rainbow as a metaphor to kind acts to others being varied but that they can all bring light to the world. Our prayer for this week drew parallels from the last few weeks and also Mr Wilkinson's Gospel worship which challenged the children to just be kind.


