Dear parents and carers,


Advent 1 : A prayer of Hope Loving God,

St Lawrence - Mrs Cambray-Smith & Miss Weatherall

Earlier this week, the children submerged eggs into different liquids - sprite, tonic water, water, vinegar and orange juice. In this experiment, the eggshell represents the enamel on our tooth. When we took them out to see what had happened the children noticed that the eggshell that had been in vinegar had the most decay, with the shell disintegrating fully. However, the egg in water (our control egg) had no plaque on it telling us it is the healthiest drink. Next, we gave the shells a gentle brush using children's toothpaste, observed what happened and had a conversation about the importance of brushing our teeth, especially after eating or drinking sugary items.

This week the children were fascinated by a 3D laptop display of the heart that Mrs Jones kindly demonstrated for us as part of our learning about the human body. The children could use the stylus pen to move the heart, feel its beat and identify all of its parts.


maths on the

Christmas Panto

On 13th December we will be welcoming the Rainbow Theatre Company to the school who will be performing the pantomime Cinderella for the children.
