

This week, in art, we studied a range of roman mosaics used in villas to see what they showed. The children were then able to design their own picture on A3 paper which they will gradually fill with small pieces of coloured paper to create their own mosaics.

In History we have been undertaking our own enquiry path linked to Roman Life. As a class we generated a list of questions such as 'What was the education system like?' or 'What did the Romans wear?' Children then used research pages, books and BBC Bitesize to make notes in their history book. This afternoon, they got to choose how to present their notes to share with the class.

This week our WOW moment has been the science experiment that we carried out. We have been investigating the effect that submerging a gummy bear in different liquids has. This has been a part of us learning about osmosis and diffusion. The children have really enjoyed carrying out their experiment and recording their findings.
