Dear Parents, Carers, Children and Staff,


This week we had a specific focus on children's mental health as part of Children's Mental Health Week 2025. We particularly followed the theme from Places2Be which was "Know yourself. Grow yourself." This was very closely linked to our values theme of Curiosity and the importance of reflecting on our feelings but also being aware of how people around us feel and how we can all play a part in the happiness of others.

Whole School Worship:

Monday and Thursday both marked Candlemas as an event within the Christian calendar. On Monday in particular we celebrated that this is the point, 40 days after Christmas, that Mary and Joseph presented Jesus



in the temple for a blessing. The children heard about the faith of Simeon and Anna who had waited all their lives to see the Son of God. We discussed the significance of this as Christians in both the Monday and Thursday worship. In particular we celebrated the coming of light, lengthening days as we prepare for spring and a new season. We discussed the hope that light can bring.

Developing our school values:

This week's story tied in with Children's Mental Health week and challenged the children to reflect on their worries and how, when we all look out for each other; when we are all aware of how others feel, we can all take action to make things better. When we do this sometimes our worries are never as big as we imagine them. The Story I used to illustrate this was Black Dog by Levi Peniford.

PFA Big Plans:

We have a fantastically dedicated PFA who have a lot of activities in the pipeline for the remainder of the year. As with all of their activities, these are all put on to bring our school community together to better and enrich the opportunities that every child in our school is able to access. The highlights for me from our meeting this week include, next week's Valentine's Disco and the launch of their sponsored readathon. The disco is free to all children and will include a drink and snack (Thursday 13th February 17:00—18:00).

Other activities planned for the remainder of the year include a quiz night, make a difference in May, the summer fair and additional enrichment activities for children. All monies raised support your child's opportunities in school.

In Science, we have been thinking about living things and the environments in which they live.



We have specifically thought about how animals adapt to these environments, such as polar bears having two layers of fur to keep them warm in arctic



conditions. We then used the knowledge we had to create our own animals and think about how they had adapted to the environment in which they lived.


Terms and Conditions Reminder

Attendance Matters

This week we reviewed our school Attendance Policy. Very little of this has changed since last year with the exception of penalty notices which have now increased to £160 per child, per parent. This figure is a statutory fine and is not controlled by the school. It applies to each child in a family.

Absences are marked and followed up on a daily basis so if your child is absent and you have not contacted the school, please expect a phone call from us. We will do this for each day of absence. Absences with no provided reason and late arrivals after 09:05 are always marked as Unauthorised (U). U codes for late arrivals will trigger an attendance meeting and a possible penalty notice if there are 10 U codes absences. Unauthorised holidays are also coded U.

The full policy can be accessed from the school website but two infographics are included with this newsletter as a reference to the key points from the policy.

The weather is bitterly cold - please make sure that your child has a named coat, hat and gloves in school.




Playground Fun


