
As this is the last newsletter of the term, we all wish you a healthy and restful break.

Gabriella - "I enjoy getting my fitness levels up and loved the 'lucky dip' station and shuttle runs."


Jack- "I love doing exercise and really enjoyed the tricep dips and shuttle




St Lawrence - Mrs Cambray-Smith & Miss Weatherall
