Head Teacher's message

Dear Parents, Carers, Children and Staff,

Now the dust has settled after our trip to Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry, we returned to an almost normal week in St Joseph's. The highlights were a visit from an ICU nurse in St Teresa class, a river study in St Lawrence and, for our choir, a very special trip to see Joseph and his Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat.

Worship:

This weeks Gospel Worship was led by Miss Thomson and theme focussed on Jubilee Joy: Freedom. Inspired by the account of Jesus' temptation in the desert, the Celebration of the Word assembly invited children to explore the Jubilee themes of slavery and freedom through the Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The reading linked to this came from Luke 4:1-13.

THE BIG MATCH



School Uniform Bulk Order Deadline —Friday 28th March


We will soon be placing a bulk order for school
