
Dear Parents, Carers, Children and Staff,

Welcome back to Term 4. We all hope you had a restful half term break.

This week's newsletter will be brief as it has been quite a short week. The children all seem happy however, and there are positive things to report from our class pages and from Mrs Bennett about this week's gymnastics festival.

Worship

This week we have been looking at the components of a strong community in RE and this was very much supported through our Gospel worship which focussed on how our feelings can influence our actions. Through this we looked at how we can control the way we act by being aware of our emotions. The children were encouraged to remember that "Love" is the key virtue that can drive our reflections and this in turn can help us to moderate how we react to others. The scripture that supported this came from Luke 6:35 and our prayer reflected how we see our relationship with God.



School Closure Day

As detailed in the last newsletter of Term 3, we were closed on Monday 24th February for staff training and school improvement activities. Our focus for the day was supporting children who have Special Educational Needs. In particular we looked at and explored our new resource called CLICKER. This is designed to help children's writing. In addition to this, we also had training and reflection led by Wiltshire Council Mainstream Inclusion Support Assistants that supported staff to understand ways we can support all children within lessons rather than as a specific intervention.





Attendance Matters

This week we reviewed our school Attendance Policy. Very little of this has changed since last year with the exception of penalty notices which have now increased to £160 per child, per parent. This figure is a statutory fine and is not controlled by the school. It applies to each child and each parent in a family, (1 child = £320 fine).

Absences are marked and followed up on a daily basis so if your child is absent and you have not contacted the school, please expect a phone call from us. We will do this for each day of absence. Absences with no provided reason and late arrivals after 09:05 are always marked as Unauthorised (U). U codes for late arrivals will trigger an attendance meeting and a possible penalty notice if there are 10 U codes absences. Unauthorised holidays are also coded U.
