

Readings Summarised

The first reading from the Book of Sirach teaches us that our true nature is revealed through our words, just as the quality of grain, clay, or fruit reveals the care it has received. This connects well with today's Gospel, where Jesus reminds us that what comes out of our mouths reflects our hearts. The Responsorial Psalm urges us to thank God for His blessings, while St. Paul encourages steadfastness in the Lord's work, warning against sinful conversations. Jesus in the Gospel condemns rash judgments, using humorous examples, but ultimately reminds us to treat others as we wish to be treated.

The Spiritual Adoption is a powerful prayer for those children who are in danger of death in the womb of their mothers. The Adoption starts with the oath taken in church usually on (or close tc) Annunciation Day and lasts for nine months till Christmas. In this time you say one decade of the Rosary each day and a daily prayer for your adopted child. You can also decide to do some extra spiritual exercise or an additional resolution, but this is optional.

Stations of the Cross and Benediction will take place on most Fridays, alternating between them with a few exceptions—please take note of these.

Fasting & Abstinence

As we prepare for Lent, a gentle reminder that Ash Wednesday (5th March) and Good Friday (18th April) are days of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting is for those aged 18–59, unless health or personal circumstances make it difficult. Abstin nce from meat is to be observed by those 14 and older.

These practices help us enter more deeply into the spirit of Lent, but if you are unable to follow them for reasons mentioned above, please do what you can with a prayerful heart.


