

We extend a warm welcome to all visitors and thank you or joining us in celebrating the Lord's love for us in the Holy Eucharist. There are no strangers here, just new friends you have not yet met!

Readings Summarised

Laetare Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, invites us to rejoice in anticipation of Easter by seeking reconciliation vith God through repentance and confession.

The first reading highlights the Israelites celebrating their first Passover in the Promised Land, using its own produce. The Responsorial Psalm calls us to glorify God together. In the second reading, St. Paul urges the Corinthians to rejoice in Christ's sacrifice, which reconciles them with God. The Go spel presents the prodigal son's joyous return to his father, who forgives him with overwhelming love. It also warns against self-righteousness, as seen in the elder brother's resentment. Jesus calls us to imitate the younger son's repentance, acknowledging our own need for God's mercy. As forgiven sinners, we are invited to experience Christ's presence in the Eucharist and to extend love and forgiveness to others, fostering lasting peace in our communities.



SECOND COLLECTION FOR PRIESTS RETIREMENT FUND (30 March 2025)


